WHEREAS, the Protecting Con	mmunity Television Act (currently S. 3218 / H.R. 5659)

WHEREAS, the *Protecting Community Television Act* (currently S. 3218 / H.R. 5659) has been introduced in Congress with the goal of maintaining the status quo by reversing the FCC Order and allowing franchise fees to be calculated as they have been for over 35 years as monetary only fees; and

<b>WHEREAS</b> , this legislation is supported by the National League of Cities, the U.S. Conference of Mayors, the National Association of Counties, the Alliance for Community Media, the League of Minnesota Cities, NATOA and MACTA.
<b>NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED</b> that the City of, Minnesota calls on Congress to pass legislation, such as the <i>Protecting Community Television Act</i> , which would undo the FCC's action;
<b>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</b> that the City urges all House members and Senators from Minnesota to co-sponsor the <i>Protecting Community Television Act</i> .
